Programming includes emergency family shelter, transitional housing, & support services aimed at the needs of adults & children. Dayspring works to transition homeless families to self-sufficiency.

Edna Martin Christian Center is a faith-based community center that has served the Martindale-Brightwood neighborhood for over 60 years. Services include an after-school program, summer youth program, senior citizens program, a wide variety of social services, & support for community organizations.

Healing Friends Foundation is a foundation raising funds and goods to eliminate poverty. We touch people's hearts in a positive way by encouraging and restoring hope that has been lost due to economic hardships. We engage, educate, empower and give support through the process.

Indiana Post Adoption Network is a parent led organization for adoptive families. I-PAN's mission is to support the development of strong adoptive families in Indiana through support, education, and resource referral. We provide these services through monthly meetings and Internet resources.

Indianapolis Neighborhood Housing Partnership strives to increase safe, decent, affordable housing opportunities that foster healthy, viable neighborhoods. The PEERS Project, initiated in 1994 by St. Vincent Hospital and Health Care Center to actively engage positive teenage role models as change agents. PEERS partners with schools to build a "character education infrastructure" giving special attention to teenagers who are taking a counter-cultural stand against the pressure to get sexually involved and use drugs – supports and affirms them, builds their confidence, and motivates others to make the right choices.

The Rebirth Project was created in early 2006 to assist victims of domestic violence. Our goal is to heal, rebuild and empower individuals to get their lives back. In late 2010, we will complete construction of a 50 unit complex that will serve as transitional housing for victims coming from short term shelters.

Young Life present in Indianapolis for over 40 years is a vibrant ministry committed to reaching young people with the gospel of Jesus Christ. Young Life is active at Brebeuf, Lawrence Central, Lawrence North, North Central, Pike, Carmel, Zionsville, Hamilton Southeastern and Westfield High Schools, as well as Carmel and Washington Township Jr. High Schools and Urban Young Life.
